## Storyline

• Maryland is playing in the National Invitation Tournament semifinals for the third time in history and first time since 2005 after dispatching No. 1 seed Alabama, 58-57, last Tuesday. The Terrapins are 14-6 all-time in the NIT and 1-1 in the semifinals; they captured the title in 1972 with wins over Jacksonville and Niagara, and fell in the 2005 semis to South Carolina.

• In winning at Alabama, Maryland captured its 25th victory of the season, the most for the program since 2006-07 when the Terps were 25-9. A win in the semifinals would give Maryland its most victories since it had 32 in the 2001-02 national championship season.

• Since opening postseason play in the ACC Tournament, Maryland has played some of its best basketball, winning five out of the last six games. Dez Wells has carried the scoring load in the postseason, averaging 18.3 points per game on .574 shooting from the field, including .727 (8-11) from 3-point range. Wells' scoring surge goes back to the regular season – the sophomore is averaging 17.8 points per game on .558 (67-120) shooting in the last 10 games.

• Alex Len recorded a double-double with 15 points and 13 rebounds at Alabama, his sixth of the season and first since the home win over Boston College on Jan. 22. Len also matched a career high with five blocks. At 11.5 points per game, the sophomore is one of four Terps averaging double-figure scoring in the postseason. Nick Faust is averaging 11.2 points per game and is shooting .400 (10-25) from 3-point range. The fourth, freshman Seth Allen, averaged 10.8 points per game off the bench in five postseason games, but fractured a bone in his shooting hand in practice on March 24 and will miss the rest of the postseason.

• The Terps are set to meet Iowa for just the third time in history. Maryland won each of the previous meetings, in 1984 and in 1999. Should they advance, the Terps would be playing their first ever game against either Baylor or BYU.

## 2012-13 University of Maryland Basketball

### Series History

• Maryland and Iowa will be meeting for the third time. The Terrapins have won each of the previous two meetings: a 78-68 overtime win in the Rainbow Classic in Honolulu, Hawaii on 12/25/1984; and an 83-65 win in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge on 11/30/1999.

• Should Maryland advance to the finals, it would be facing an opponent it has never met. The Terps have never played Baylor or BYU.

### Quick Hitters

• Maryland has won 25 games in a season for the ninth time in school history. The Terps also won 25 or more in 1971-72 (27), 1984-85 (25), 1994-95 (26), 1998-99 (28), 1999-2000 (25), 2000-01 (25), 2001-02 (32) and 2006-07 (25). Mark Turgeon is the third Maryland coach to achieve the feat, joining Lefty Driesell and Gary Williams.

• Turgeon's current winning percentage of .609 (42-27) is the best mark by a Maryland coach in his first two seasons. Bud Millikan had a .592 winning percentage and Gary Williams had a .574 mark.

• Dez Wells is averaging 17.1 points per game in Maryland's 16 games away from home this season (11 road + 5 neutral).

• Wells scored 30 points against Duke in the ACC Tournament semifinals, the most points by a Terp this season. He is the first Terp to score 30 in a game since Terrell Stoglin had 33 at Miami in two overtimes on 2/1/2012.

• The Terps are appearing in the NIT for the eighth time in school history and hold a 14-6 record in the tournament. Maryland owns one NIT title, in 1972, when they defeated Niagara in the championship game 100-69.

• The NIT appearance marks the ninth time in the last 11 years that head coach Mark Turgeon has led his team to the postseason. Turgeon led Wichita State to the NIT in 2003, 2004 and 2005, and the NCAA Sweet Sixteen in 2006. He then led Texas A&M to the NCAA second round all four of his years in College Station (2008-11).

• Maryland has reached the 20-win plateau for the first time since 2009-10, when it went 24-9 and reached the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Head coach Mark Turgeon's teams have now won at least 20 games in five of the last six seasons and eight of the last 10. The exceptions are last season, Turgeon's first at Maryland, and 2006-07, his last at Wichita State. The Terps are one of six ACC teams to reach the 20-win mark; Miami, Duke, North Carolina, Virginia and NC State also have at least 20 wins.

• With Tuesday's game, Maryland will set a single-season record for games played. The previous record was 37 in 1984-85.

• Logan Aronhalt connected on seven 3-pointers at Boston College on 2/19. That's the most by a Terp since Mike Jones hit a Comcast Center record nine on Dec. 28, 2006, vs. Missouri-Kansas City.

• Maryland did not beat a ranked opponent in either of the last two seasons. The Terps have three wins over a ranked team this year: No. 14/15 NC State, No. 2/1 Duke (Feb. 16), and No. 2/2 Duke (March 15).

• The Terps are 23-2 this season when they have the lead with 5:00 left in the game, and 1-0 when tied with 5:00 left. The losses came at Florida State (1/30) and at Virginia in overtime (3/10).

• The 13-game winning streak Maryland went on earlier this season is tied for the second longest in school history, trailing just the 14-game streak the Terps went on in 1931-32. Maryland also went on a 13-game win streak in 2001-02, the year they went on to win the national

- Logan Aronhalt is averaging one 3-point field goal made for every 8.6 minutes on the floor. By comparison, the ACC leader in 3PT FGs made, Scott Wood of NC State, made one 3-pointer every 11.4 minutes on the floor.
- The Terps are 18-3 when making as many or more free throws than the opponent, and 7-9 when making fewer free throws.
- When Seth Allen, Jake Layman and Shaquille Cleare drew starts against UMES, it marked the first time Maryland started three true freshmen since Dec. 28, 1993, when Keith Booth, Matt Kovarik and Joe Smith did vs. Hofstra. The Terps have started three freshmen in a game four times this season.

## Youth Movement

- Seven of the 10 players in Maryland's regular rotation are underclassmen and 81.8 percent of Maryland's scoring (58.1 of 71.0 points per game) is coming from underclassmen. Maryland's top four scorers are underclassmen in sophomores Dez Wells (13.2 ppg), Alex Len (11.8 ppg) and Nick Faust (9.3 ppg) and freshman Seth Allen (7.8 ppg).
- Just twice in the past 30 years has a larger percentage of Maryland's scoring come from underclassmen. In 2003-04, 82 percent came from underclassmen, and in 1993-94, 97 percent did.
- Additionally, 141 of 185 starts (76.2%) this season have gone to underclassmen. That is the second-highest percentage in the past 30 years, behind only 1993-94 when every start went to underclassmen.
- The Terps have just one 1,000-point scorer on the roster this season in graduate student Logan Aronhalt. Aronhalt scored 1,100 points at Albany before transferring to Maryland prior to this season. Maryland's next top scorers are Wells (801), James Padgett (652), Faust (629) and Len (567).

## Hitting the Mark

- Maryland has assisted on 56 percent (539 of 963) of its field goals this season. The Terps have recorded double-digit assists in 33 of 37 games (exceptions are at Miami, at North Carolina, vs. North Carolina and vs. Denver), and rank t-2nd in the ACC with 14.6 per game. Maryland is 20-4 when recording at least 14 assists.
- On average, Maryland has recorded 16.4 assists per game in wins, while in its losses it has averaged just 11.1.

## Hot Shooting

- Maryland ranks third in the ACC in field goal percentage at .466, behind just NC State (.494) and Duke (.477). That marks also ranks 34th nationally. The Terps have shot above 40 percent in 16 of the past 18 games. Maryland has shot better than 50 percent 14 times this season and is undefeated when doing so.
- Against Wake Forest (2/2), Maryland recorded its fifth-best field goal percentage in program history at .673. The four single-game marks better than that are: .833 (15-18) vs. South Carolina, 1/9/71; .739 (34-46) vs. Wake Forest, 1/28/86; .732 (30-41) vs. NC State, 12/20/80; and .704 (50-71) vs. Miami (OH), 12/28/79.

## Field-goal Percentage Defense

- Maryland leads the ACC and ranks 10th nationally in field goal percentage defense at .384. The Terps have held 21 of 37 opponents under 40 percent shooting, including 11 of 18 ACC (regular season) opponents.

## Super Subs

- Maryland's bench has been an asset all season, as the Terps' non-starters have outscored the opponents non-starters in 31 of 37 games. Most recently, the Terps had their fourth-highest bench output of the season with 42 against Niagara, outscored Denver 22-3 and Alabama 18-11.
- On the year, Maryland's bench has a 930-450 (25.1 to 12.1 per game) advantage over the opponent.
- All 10 players in Maryland's regular rotation are averaging double-figure minutes, and no player is averaging more than 29 minutes per game (Dez Wells is first at 28.6).
- Logan Aronhalt has been a consistent contributor as a long-range specialist. He is 14 3-point field goals made shy of qualifying for the ACC lead, but his .432 mark from beyond the arc would rank third in the league. He has made at least one 3-pointer in 29 of 37 games this season. Of his 74 field goals made this season, 60 are 3-pointers.

## Honors and Accolades

- Three Terps earned some form of postseason accolades this year: Alex Len was named to the All-ACC Defensive team and was honorable mention All-ACC; Logan Aronhalt was named Academic All-ACC; and Dez Wells was named to the All-ACC Tournament Team.
- Three Terps have earned ACC Weekly honors this season. Charles Mitchell earned ACC

Rookie of the Week honors on Dec. 31 for his play against Delaware State on Dec. 29. Mitchell came off the bench to score 19 points and grab 14 rebounds, both career highs. Seth Allen earned the award on Feb. 18 after he scored 16 points and hit the game-winning free throws vs. Duke. Alex Len was Player of the Week on Nov. 12 after scoring 23 points and grabbing 12 rebounds vs. Kentucky.

### Down Goes #1

- When Maryland beat Duke 83-81 on Saturday, Feb. 16, it marked the Terps first win over a No. 1 ranked team since topping No. 1 North Carolina on Jan. 19, 2008. The Blue Devils were ranked first in the Coaches poll and second in the AP poll at the time of the victory.

### Sophomore Jump

- After averaging 6.0 points and 5.4 rebounds per game as a freshman, Alex Len has developed into a consistent scoring threat as a sophomore. Len is averaging 11.8 points per game, which ranks 27th in the ACC. His 7.8 rebounds per game rank fifth. Len also ranks third in the league with 1.9 blocks per game. He has six double-doubles this season: against Kentucky (23 & 12), Northwestern (13 & 13), Monmouth (14 & 10), Florida State (15 & 10), Boston College (16 & 13) and at Alabama (15 & 13).

### Rare Performance

- When freshmen Seth Allen and Jake Layman both reached the 20-point plateau against Virginia Tech, it marked a rare performance. Prior to Allen and Layman's 20-point games, a freshman had scored 20 or more points in a game just 10 times since 1994-95 – with none of those occurring in the same game. In fact, the last time two different freshmen scored 20 or more points in a game in the same season was 1992-93 when Exree Hipp and Johnny Rhodes did it.

### On Assists

- Maryland ranks tied for second in the ACC with 14.6 assists per game. Pe'Shon Howard, Seth Allen, Nick Faust and Dez Wells all rank in the top-20 of the ACC in assists per game.
- Maryland's 28 assists against LIU Brooklyn were nine more than the team's season-high of 19 last year. The last time a Maryland team had more assists in a game was in the 2002-03 season, when the Terps had 29 on two occasions. The Terps also had 28 assists in a game on 2/9/11 vs. Longwood and 12/31/05 vs. VMI. The school record for assists in a game is 37.
- Howard's 13 assists vs. LIU Brooklyn are tied for the fourth-most in a single game by a Terp. The only better performances are: Greivis Vasquez (2008) and Terrell Stokes (1998) with 15; and Steve Blake (2002) and Terrell Stokes (1996) with 14.

### Force on the Boards

- Maryland leads the ACC and ranks fourth nationally in rebounding margin at plus-8.7 per game. Just Colorado State (plus-11.9), Quinnipiac (plus-10.4) and Utah State (plus-9.1) rank above that.
- The Terps have built advantages on the boards in 34 of 37 games this season (exceptions - Virginia, at Boston College, at Georgia Tech).
- Alex Len and Charles Mitchell are the biggest factors in that; Len averages 7.8 rpg and Mitchell averages 5.4. Len ranks fifth in the conference and Mitchell ranks 19th, including third among freshmen.
- Len ranks third in the conference with 2.9 offensive rebounds per game, and the Terps are averaging 12.1 offensive rebounds per game as a team, second in the league behind North Carolina (13.6).
- Mitchell made an impressive debut by grabbing 10 rebounds in his first career game, against then-No. 3 Kentucky. That's the most rebounds by a Maryland freshman in his debut since Buck Williams had 13 against Bucknell in 1978. Williams went on to lead the ACC in rebounding that year (10.8 pg) en route to capturing ACC Rookie of the Year honors.

### Head Coach Mark Turgeon

The eighth head coach in Maryland Basketball history arrived in College Park with a stellar resume:

- Turgeon led his teams to at least 20 wins in eight of the last 10 seasons (including this year).
- His teams have advanced to postseason play eight times in the last 10 years, including NCAA berths in five of the last seven seasons. His record in the last nine years is 201-99 (.670).
- As a player, assistant coach and head coach, Turgeon has compiled a 26-13 NCAA Tournament record (8-4 as a player, 13-4 as an assistant, 5-5 as a head coach).
- In 14 NCAA Tournament appearances as a player, assistant coach and head coach, Turgeon has lost an NCAA opener only twice (Oregon in 1995 under Coach Jerry Green, and 2011 as the head coach at Texas A&M - 57-50 loss vs. Florida State).

## Milestones, Streaks, etc.

- Prior to the win over No. 14 NC State on Jan. 16, Maryland's last win over a ranked team was a 79-72 win over then-No.4 Duke on 3/3/2010 at Comcast Center. The Terps' last road win over a ranked team was an 82-80 win at then-No. 1 North Carolina on 1/19/2008.
- Maryland's last losing season came in 1992-93, the last year of devastating NCAA sanctions levied against previous staffs at Maryland. Each school in the ACC has had a losing season since the Terps fell below .500 some 20 seasons ago. In fact, 9 of the 11 ACC opponents have suffered through a losing season since the Terps won the NCAA title in 2002, with Duke and UNC the exceptions.

## Hitting the Weights

- Several Terps, under the tutelage of director of basketball performance Kyle Tarp, have made significant body changes in the offseason. Most notable are:
  - Alex Len - increased body weight from 219 lbs to 251 since arriving at Maryland. Increased lean weight from 202 to 235 (net 33 lbs of muscle).
  - Nick Faust - gained 24 lbs since last year (added 22 lbs of muscle).
  - The NCAA rule allowing summer workouts also provided the opportunity for several of Maryland's newcomers to hit the weight room.
    - Jake Layman gained 15 lbs in the offseason, adding 17 lbs of muscles and losing 2 pounds of fat.
    - Charles Mitchell - lost 21 lbs (lost 24 lbs of fat and gained 3 lbs of muscle)
    - Shaquille Cleare - lost 24 pounds and decreased body fat from 20.7% to 13.8%. He bench pressed 185 lbs for 29 reps (NBA combine record is 27).

## Working Overtime

- Maryland is 48-51 all-time in overtime games. It's lone overtime game this season was a 61-58 loss at Virginia in the regular-season finale. Last season, Maryland was 0-2 in overtime.
  - Maryland has played at least one overtime game in 17 of the last 20 seasons. The Terps did not go overtime in 2010-11, marking the first time in eight seasons they finished business in regulation.
    - Maryland's 89-74 OT win over Vermont (11/21/08) marked the largest winning margin in an overtime game for the Terps, who outscored the Catamounts 17-2, including the first 17 points of the extra session.
    - Maryland is 25-18 in overtime games played at home, including a 6-1 mark at Comcast Center. Prior to the Virginia game last season, the last overtime game in College Park was an 88-85 victory over then-3rd-ranked North Carolina on 2/21/2009.

## Home Sweet Home

- Maryland has been a dominant home team over the years:
  - The Terps are 864-298 (.743) all-time at home dating back to 1923-24.
  - Maryland is 158-36 (.813) all-time at Comcast Center.
  - Maryland is 271-41 (.868) at home the last 12 seasons (since 1998-99).
  - Maryland is 76-17 (.817) in home-openers in College Park all-time, including a 36-game winning streak (last loss on 11/27/76 to Notre Dame, 80-79, OT). The Terps did not play a home game in 1918-19.

## Fear the Turtle!

- Maryland is one of the most consistent winning programs in the country following more than a decade of excellence:
  - The Terps have averaged 22.25 wins per season the last 16 years, including eight consecutive 20-win seasons from 1996-2004.
  - Maryland has 17 postseason appearances in the last 19 years, including 11 consecutive trips to the NCAA Tournament from 1993-2004.
  - The Terrapins have won at least two postseason games (ACC, NCAA, NIT) in nine of the last 14 seasons.
    - The Terps have advanced to the NCAA Sweet sixteen seven times in the last 18 years.
    - Maryland made consecutive trips to the NCAA Final Four in 2001 and 2002 .
    - The Terps captured the 2002 NCAA National Championship.
    - The Terps captured the 2004 ACC Tournament Championship.
    - Maryland shared the 2010 ACC Regular-Season Title with eventual national-champion Duke.

## Terps Put Together Another Top-25 Class

On Wednesday, Nov. 14, head coach Mark Turgeon announced the signing of Damonte Dodd and Roddy Peters to the class of 2013. The two signees give Maryland the 25th-ranked class nationally according to 247Sports.com. That gives Maryland its second straight recruiting class ranked in the top 25, after the 2012 haul landed in the top 20.

# MarkTURGEON

► **292-186 (15th Season) / 42-27 (2nd Season at Maryland)**

Entering his second season at the helm of the University of Maryland men's basketball team, Mark Turgeon looks to continue to build upon the momentum he created after finishing his first season at College Park with a winning record and one of the nation's top-rated recruiting classes.

Turgeon, who came to College Park after directing Texas A&M to four consecutive appearances in the NCAA Tournament, led Maryland to a 17-15 record in 2011-12. Afterwards, he signed a recruiting class that was ranked No. 15 by Rivals.com. He has also signed a top-25 class for 2013. At A&M, he posted a 97-40 record in four seasons and was named the Big 12 Conference Coach of the Year in both 2010 and 2011. He is the only coach in Big 12 history with at least 24 victories in each of his four seasons.

In the area of recruiting, Turgeon saw immediate dividends for his efforts as his first class at Maryland was ranked as a consensus top 20 group.

Turgeon, 47, replaced longtime Terrapin head coach Gary Williams, who announced his retirement in May of 2011 after 22 seasons at Maryland.

"We're thrilled to bring Mark to the University, where I'm sure he will continue to build on the great legacy and success of Maryland Basketball," director of athletics Kevin Anderson said at the time of Turgeon's hiring. "In Mark, we have brought one of the outstanding young coaches in the country, and one who has a proven record of achievement on and off the court. We couldn't be more excited."

Turgeon is 292-186 in his 15th season overall as a head coach. In seven years at Wichita State, he built the Shockers into a power in the Missouri Valley Conference, earning the league

title and an NCAA Sweet Sixteen appearance in 2006. In that NCAA Tournament, Wichita State beat Seton Hall and Tennessee before losing to eventual Final Four participant George Mason.

He went 128-89 at Wichita State (2000-07), posting the third-most wins in school history. The Shockers went to three straight NITs from 2003 to 2005 in addition to the 2006 NAAs, the first time WSU had four straight postseason appearances in 40 years.

He began his head-coaching career at Jacksonville State, going 17-11 in his final season there (1999-2000) after going 8-18 in his first year.

Turgeon was an assistant at Kansas for five seasons, first under Larry Brown (1987-88) and then under Roy Williams (1988-92). The Jayhawks made the NCAA Tournament in four of those seasons, winning the national championship in 1988 and finishing second in 1991. KU also won Big Eight titles in 1991 and 1992 with Turgeon on staff.

He was the top assistant under Jerry Green at Oregon from 1992-97 and was an assistant coach under Brown with the Philadelphia 76ers in 1997-98 before taking the head coaching position at Jacksonville State.

A point guard at Kansas from 1984-87, Turgeon was the first player in Jayhawks history to play in four straight NCAA Tournaments. KU went 108-33 under Brown in that stretch.



Turgeon served as team captain in his junior and senior seasons, leading the Jayhawks to the 1986 NCAA Final Four.

As a student-athlete, he was selected to the Big Eight All-Academic Team in 1986 and was a Big Eight All-Freshman pick in 1984. He earned a bachelor of science degree in personnel administration from Kansas in 1987.

A native of Topeka, Kan., Turgeon led Hayden High School to back-to-back Class 4A state titles in 1982 and 1983, earning all-tournament honors each year. A first team all-state pick as a senior, Hayden went 47-3 in his high-school career.

In the summer of 2008, Turgeon was inducted into the Topeka Sports Hall of Fame.

Turgeon ("TURGE-in") is married to the former Ann Fowler of Chicago, Ill, and they have two sons - William Harris and Leo - and a daughter, Ella.
