The top-seeded Maryland men's lacrosse team (13-3) looks to advance to its sixth NCAA semifinal in seven seasons Sunday, May 21, when it faces 8-seed Albany in Newark, Del., at 2:30 pm. Maryland traveled to Albany for a midweek contest on April 12 and narrowly defeated the Great Danes, 12-11.

FACING OFF

1

Sunday's matchup marks the first postseason meeting in history between Maryland and Albany, with the Terps holding a 2-0 advantage in an all-time series that began in 2016. The Terps took down the Danes, 12-11, on April 12 as **Ben Chisolm** became the unlikely hero with two fourth quarter goals.

5

Maryland head coach **John Tillman** holds a perfect 5-0 record all-time in NCAA quarterfinal action. Other than an overtime win in 2011, the last four quarterfinal contests have been largely one-sided win margins. Including last season's six-goal win over Syracuse, the Terps have won their last four quarterfinal games by an average of 6.8 goals.

5

Junior midfielder **Tim Rotanz** scored a career-high five goals in the NCAA opener against Bryant, becoming the fourth Terp to score at least four goals in a game this season (**Connor Kelly, Dylan Maltz, Matt Rambo**).

6

A key component to Maryland's regular season win over Albany was its ability to close out quarters with momentum. The Terps scored six goals in the last two minutes of quarters against the Great Danes, including goals with 17, 11 and 3 seconds remaining.

6

Senior Tewaaron finalist **Matt Rambo** tied a Maryland NCAA record with six assists against Bryant (John Kaestner - 1972), and finished the game with a career-high eight points. The attackman now has 26 points over his last four NCAA games (6.5/g) dating back to 2016.

15

Head coach **John Tillman** is 15-6 overall in the NCAA Tournament. His 15 wins since 2011 are the most among all Division I coaches during that span. Tillman is looking to lead Maryland to its sixth NCAA semifinal in the past seven seasons.

31

Maryland has made a habit of jumping out to strong starts, outscoring opponents by 31 goals in the first quarter (64 to 33). The Terps are 66-9 under **John Tillman** when leading after the first quarter.

35

The Terrapins' shot percentage has been a strong point all season, currently ranking third nationally at 35 percent. Maryland's shooting ability was on full display last weekend against Bryant, when it shot 13-for-28 (.464). **Tim Rotanz** led the way with five goals on seven shots.

50

Senior **Matt Rambo** has totaled 50 points in 12 career NCAA games, the most among active players nationally. Rambo's 50 career NCAA points is tied for 9th among all players since 2000 with Ryan Powell. Mikey Powell's 58 points are the most since 2000 (see chart on page 3).

155

Maryland is the most experienced team in the NCAA Tournament, with its players combining for 155 career NCAA games played and reaching three final fours. The Terps have four players who have played 12 NCAA games: **Isaiah Davis-Allen, Colin Heacock, Mac Pons** and **Matt Rambo**.

GAME NOTES

COACHING MATCHUP

- **John Tillman** is in his 10th season as a head coach, and seventh with the Terps, with a 113-48 career record for a .702 winning percentage. Tillman is 93-29 (.762) as Maryland's head coach. He has had immense success since taking over the program in 2011, advancing to five NCAA semifinals and four title games. The Terps also lead the nation during that time period in All-America selections (38) and Major League Lacrosse draft selections (26).
- Albany's Scott Marr is in his 17th season as head coach of Albany. Prior to Albany, Marr was an assistant coach at Maryland from 1995-2000 under former Maryland coach Dick Edell. The Terps made three NCAA finals appearances in those six years.

TILLMAN IN THE NCAA'S

- The meeting with Albany will be **John Tillman's** 22nd NCAA tournament game as a head coach, compiling a 15-6 overall record. His 15 wins since 2011 are the most in the NCAA during that six-year span.
- Tillman has led Maryland to five final fours and four championship game appearances in six seasons.
- Tillman is 6-1 in first round games, 5-0 in quarterfinal games and 4-1 in semifinals. Tillman has been largely dominant in quarterfinal action, winning by an average margin of 6.8 goals in the last four appearances.
- Tillman is the only coach in NCAA history to guide two unseeded teams to back-to-back appearances in the Final Four (2011-12).
- As an assistant coach, Tillman helped guide Navy to four consecutive NCAA tournaments from 2004-07, including a run to the 2004 championship game.

MARYLAND IN THE NCAA'S

- Maryland is playing in its 40th NCAA Tournament - the second-most since the inception of the NCAA Tournament in 1971. The Terps have also qualified for 15 straight NCAA Tournaments - the longest active streak in the nation.
- The Terps have won the third-most Division I NCAA Tournament games, compiling a 57-37 overall record in 94 games. Only Johns Hopkins (70-35) and Syracuse (64-25) have won more Division I tournament games.

VETERAN TERPS

- Maryland features a veteran group of nine players on its roster that have played at least 50 career collegiate games, in addition to eight players that have played at least nine NCAA Tournament games.
- Senior **Matt Rambo's** 72 games played in his career is a Maryland program-record, with **Isaiah Davis-Allen** one game behind (71).

SERIES HISTORY VS. ALBANY

- Sunday's matchup marks just the third meeting in history between Maryland and Albany, and the first-ever postseason meeting.
- After postponing its original meeting due to weather, Maryland and Albany finally met in a midweek game on April 12, with the Terps holding on for a 12-11 victory. Senior **Ben Chisolm** scored two of his nine career goals in the fourth quarter, while Dan Morris made 10 saves in net.

RAMBO AMONG BEST IN NCAA TOURNAMENT

- Senior attackman **Matt Rambo** has one of the best NCAA Tournament resumes of all-time, totaling an active NCAA-best 50 points (25g, 25a) in 12 career NCAA games. (see chart at right)
- With the addition of his career-high eight points against Bryant to open the 2017 NCAA Tournament, Rambo now has 31 points over his last five postseason games (6.2 points/g).

TERPS MOVE PAST BRYANT IN NCAA OPENER

- Senior Tewaaron finalist **Matt Rambo** recorded a career-high eight points and matched a program NCAA Tournament record with six assists to lead the No. 1 Maryland men's lacrosse team to a 13-10 victory over Bryant in the first round of the NCAA Tournament May 14.
- Holding a narrow 6-4 advantage at the halftime break, the Terps blew the game open with a massive 7-1 run to take an insurmountable 13-5 lead. **Tim Rotanz** added a career-high five goals in the win.

MARYLAND IN BIG PLAY

- The Terps have experienced great success since the Big Ten's inception in 2015, claiming three regular season titles and two tournament title (2016, 2017).
- Maryland holds an 13-2 all-time record in regular season conference action, in addition to a 17-3 mark including tournament play. The Terps are 4-1 all-time in Big Ten Tournament action.

MARYLAND'S SEASONED ATTACK

- Maryland's senior-laden attack line of **Matt Rambo**, **Colin Heacock** and **Dylan Maltz** is quite possibly the best in all of college lacrosse. The trio has combined for 454 points and 305 goals - both marks rank second nationally.
- Rambo, Heacock and Maltz had started 29 consecutive games together before Heacock missed the Ohio State regular season game due to injury. They have started 33 games together overall.

GAME NOTES

TERPS WIN BIG TEN TOURNAMENT

- Senior **Colin Heacock** scored the go-ahead goal with 3:27 left in the game to give the No. 1 Maryland men's lacrosse team a 10-9 win over 2-seed Ohio State to win the Big Ten Conference Tournament title May 6 at Jesse Owens Memorial Stadium.
- Junior **Connor Kelly**, who finished with 10 points (9G, 1A) in the tournament, was named Big Ten Tournament MVP. Kelly notched a career high five goals in the championship bout including three of the five Terrapin goals in the first half. Joining Kelly on the Big Ten All-Tournament team was midfielder **Tim Rotanz**, defender **Tim Muller** and goalkeeper **Dan Morris**.

GET TO 10 AND WIN

- Since **John Tillman** took over the program in 2011, Maryland has won 78 of the 85 games in which it has scored 10 or more goals for a .917 winning percentage.
- Maryland is also 59-4 since 2013 when scoring at least 10 goals.

HOLDING OPPONENTS TO SINGLE-DIGITS

- Maryland is 78-11 since Tillman took over the program in 2011 when it allows nine goals or less, for an .876 winning percentage.
- The Terps are 55-6 since 2013 when allowing less than 10 goals.

TERPS DOWN PSU; ADVANCE TO B1G FINALS

- Junior **Dan Morris** matched his career-high with 16 saves and **Connor Kelly** scored four goals to lead the No. 1 Maryland men's lacrosse team to an 8-6 victory over 4th-seeded Penn State in the Big Ten Tournament semifinals Thursday.
- Kelly, who has 12 goals over his last three Big Ten Tournament contests, had a hand in all five of Maryland's last five goals, including scoring the final four. Maryland imposed its will in the first half defensively, holding the Nittany Lions to just one goal. Penn State was scoreless in the final 22:23 of the half.

TERPS BEAT HOPKINS TO CLAIM B1G CROWN

- Senior **Matt Rambo** tallied seven points to become Maryland's all-time points leader and the No. 5 Maryland men's lacrosse won its third consecutive Big Ten regular season championship with a resounding 12-5 victory over No. 8 Johns Hopkins in the 115th installment of "The Rivalry."
- Junior **Connor Kelly** added four goals for the Terps, including three in the first quarter, as 14,353 fans took in the action - the most for a Maryland regular season game since 1989.

TERPS FALL AT OHIO STATE IN OT

- Senior **Matt Rambo** totaled five points on three goals and two assists as the No. 2 Maryland men's lacrosse team fell in overtime, 11-10, to No. 7 Ohio State April 22 at Ohio Stadium.
- Junior **Tim Rotanz** added four points, including his third consecutive hat trick, while **Tim Muller** and **Nick Brozowski** combined for five caused turnovers.

MARYLAND BEATS RUTGERS IN 3OT

- Junior **Connor Kelly's** goal with 55 seconds remaining in the third overtime propelled No. 3 Maryland to a gutsy road victory over No. 11 Rutgers on April 16.
- Goalkeeper **Dan Morris** was phenomenal in goal for Maryland. After failing to record a save in the first quarter, Morris finished with a career-high 16 saves in the game. Five of his 16 saves came in the three overtime periods. Senior **Matt Rambo** led all scorers with six points on two goals and four assists, while Kelly and **Tim Rotanz** each contributed a hat trick.

MARYLAND WINS #800 AT ALBANY

- Senior **Ben Chisolm** scored two fourth quarter goals and **Dan Morris** made 12 key saves to lead the No. 3 Maryland men's lacrosse team to a 12-11 win over No. 5 Albany in a midweek game on April 12.
- The victory marked Maryland's 800th win as a varsity program, becoming the third team in NCAA Division I history to reach the milestone (Johns Hopkins, Syracuse).

RAMBO WATCH

- Senior **Matt Rambo** made history on April 29 against Johns Hopkins becoming Maryland's all-time leader in points, and he is very close to breaking the all-time goals record as well.
- With 75 points (36g, 39a) in 16 games, Rambo needs just five goals to break the goals record (153) set by Joe Walters from 2003-06.

TERPS' 92ND SEASON OF LACROSSE

- The Terps boast an all-time record of 805-267-4 (.749), dating back to the first varsity team in 1924 (a team was not fielded in 1944 and 1945 due to World War II). Maryland has finished with a .500 or better record in all 92 seasons of existence, including the 2017 season.
- During the decade of the 2000s, Maryland went 111-49 for a .694 win percentage, making it the winningest decade in Terrapin lacrosse history. In the decade of the 1990s, Maryland posted a 95-47 record. The .669 winning percentage matched Maryland's win percentage of the 1980s when the Terps went 83-41 and also compiled a .669 win percentage.
- Through 2016, Maryland is 92-30 in the 2010's for a .754 winning percentage - on pace for the best decade in Maryland history.

THE 800 CLUB

- Maryland became just the third team in Division I history to reach 800 all-time victories with its 12-11 victory over Albany on April 12, 2017. The Terps joined Johns Hopkins and Syracuse as the only other program's to reach the milestone.
- The Terps reached 800 wins in just 1,070 games for a winning percentage of .750 since their inception as a varsity program in 1924. Maryland has never had a losing season in 92 years.

JOHN TILLMAN

HEAD COACH • SEVENTH SEASON AT MARYLAND • CORNELL '91

Tillman has experienced immense success since taking the reins in College Park, leading the Terps to five NCAA Final Fours and four championship game appearances in six seasons. He has garnered an 80-26 (.755) overall record at Maryland - the most wins ever by a Maryland coach through their first six seasons. The Maryland defense has ranked in the nation's top-10 in scoring defense all six seasons of his tenure.

Maryland has won 32 games over the last two seasons - the most in the nation over that span. Additionally, Tillman has won 14 NCAA Tournament games since 2011 - also an NCAA-best.

Tillman's players have been lauded with accolades since 2011, as he has developed 38 All-Americans (most nationally during span) and produced 26 Major League Lacrosse draft selections. In 2016, the Terps had six players selected in the first 19 picks - a Major League Lacrosse record.

Additionally, the program's accomplishments have translated to the classroom, as Tillman has had 12 USILA Scholar All-Americans in six seasons. The 2015 spring semester and 2016 fall semester combined for the program's highest GPA in more than 10 years.

The Terrapins won a program record 17 games in addition to piecing together a single-season record 16 consecutive wins in 2016 as they returned to the National Championship game, where they lost an overtime heartbreaker to UNC. Tillman's team swept the Big Ten regular season and tournament titles, while compiling the NCAA's top-ranked RPI. Eight players earned USILA All-America honors and Matt Dunn was named a Senior CLASS Award First Team All-American.

Maryland had another phenomenal season in 2015 when Tillman led the team to a Terrapin single-season record 15 victories and a berth in the NCAA national title game. The Terps featured the top-ranked scoring defense (7.1 goals allowed/g), as junior Kyle Bernlohr claimed the Ensign C. Markland Kelly, Jr. Award. Additionally, five players earned USILA All-America honors and Casey Ikeda was also a USILA Scholar All-American.

Tillman captured his first career ACC Coach of the Year honor by leading the Terps to the 2014 ACC regular season championship and the program's third Final Four appearance in four seasons. Senior Niko Amato earned the Ensign C. Markland Kelly, Jr. Award as the nation's most outstanding goalie, as five Maryland players earned USILA All-America honors.

Tillman's third season in College Park saw the Terps ascend to the top of the national rankings for the first time since 2006, following a 12-10 win at then-No. 1 Loyola on Feb. 21. Maryland earned a bid to the NCAA tournament for the 11th consecutive season, which is the longest active streak in Division I men's lacrosse. Seniors Jesse Bernhardt and John Haus became the first Terrapins since 2006 to earn first-team All-America honors, leading a group of seven Maryland honorees.

The 2012 season was viewed by many as a rebuilding year after Maryland graduated 17 seniors in 2011, but Tillman rallied the team and the Terrapins returned to the NCAA championship game with sensational postseason performances from seniors Joe Cummings and Drew Snider among others. Five Terps earned All-America honors following Maryland's 12-6 campaign and junior Jesse Bernhardt was selected as co-recipient of the ACC's first-ever Defensive Player of the Year award.

In his first season in College Park Tillman guided the Terps to a 13-5 record, the 2011 ACC championship (the program's first since 2005) and a berth in the NCAA championship game (the first for the Terps since 1998). Eight Terrapins earned All-America honors in Tillman's first season, which is the most Maryland players selected in a single-season since 2004.

Widely considered one of the top coaches in the country and a dynamic recruiter, Tillman was the head men's lacrosse coach at Harvard for three seasons prior to his arrival in College Park. His last recruiting class for the Crimson was rated No. 3 in the nation, according to Inside Lacrosse.

During his three seasons at Harvard, Tillman compiled an overall record of 20-19, including an 8-5 mark in 2009, which was the Crimson's highest win total since 1999.

Tillman's time at Harvard produced a number of the most memorable wins in the program's history. This past season, during which Harvard climbed as high as No. 11 in the national polls, Tillman guided the Crimson to an 11-8 victory over No. 6 Princeton, which was the first time Harvard had defeated the Tigers in 20 years. In 2009, Tillman led the Crimson to a season-opening 9-6 upset victory at No. 5 Duke.

Tillman improved his teams in every aspect over the past three seasons. Prior to his arrival in Cambridge, Mass., the Crimson ranked 40th and 42nd, respectively, in total offense and defense. Tillman's defense ranked as high as No. 3 in the nation, while his offense rose to No. 15 in the country. He also dramatically improved Harvard's extra-man offense, from the 51st-ranked unit before he arrived, to a perennial top 15 unit.

Prior to Harvard, Tillman spent 12 seasons at the U.S. Naval Academy in Annapolis, Md. After six seasons as an assistant coach, he was promoted to head assistant coach and offensive coordinator prior to the 2002 season. From 2004 through 2007, Tillman helped lead the Midshipmen to some of the most successful seasons in program history, including four straight NCAA tournament berths, four consecutive Patriot League tournament titles and four straight Patriot League regular season championships.

In 2004, with Tillman at the helm of the Navy offense, the Mids made a remarkable run through the NCAA tournament, defeating three Ivy League teams (Penn, Cornell and Princeton) en route to a spot in the national championship game. Tillman's offense was a key component of Navy's success that season, ranking third in the nation in scoring offense. Following the Mids' tremendous 2004 season, Tillman was awarded the first of his two Collegiate Lacrosse Assistant Coach of the Year Awards by the Maryland State Lacrosse Coaches Association.

During his 12 season at the Naval Academy, Tillman was responsible for helping develop first team All-America midfielders Graham Gill and Billy Looney and second team All-America attackman Jon Birsner. In his 12 seasons in Annapolis, the Mids compiled an overall record of 104-63.

Tillman started his coaching career as an assistant coach at Ithaca College. He spent four seasons (1992-95) with the Bombers, helping lead them to the Division III national semifinals in 1992.

In addition to his extensive coaching experience, Tillman also serves as a member of the Tewaaraton Award Men's Selection Committee.

A 1991 graduate of Cornell University's School of Hotel Administration, Tillman was a three-year member of the school's Dean's list. He had the opportunity to play for legendary coach Richie Moran and was a member of the 1989 squad that earned a berth in the NCAA tournament.

Tillman was a goalie when he entered college, but played a number of positions for the Big Red, giving him a great appreciation and understanding for the overall game of lacrosse.

Tillman played professionally for the Baltimore Thunder and the Washington Power of the National Lacrosse League. During his final two seasons in Baltimore, he helped the Thunder reach the NLL Championship and Semifinals. Tillman also played for the Toyota Lacrosse Club, who won five-consecutive Southern Division Championships, including a world championship in 2000.

A native of Corning, N.Y., Tillman was previously commissioned into the U.S. Navy as a fleet support officer and was awarded the Navy Achievement Medal.
